Please specify your preference for oral or poster presentation when you submit your abstract. Talks will be scheduled in 20-minute time slots, including 5 minutes for questions. Please follow the format illustrated below and limit your abstract to 250 words (including title).

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

The deadline for receipt of abstracts is Monday, December 7, 2009, by 8:00am. Abstracts should be formatted as specified below and saved as a WordPerfect or MS Word document. Please use the primary author's last name, or last name and first initial, within the filename. For example: "SmithJ_AWRA_abs.doc"

STUDENT AWARDS

Title

Byline

Last name of primary author, first name and middle initial, affiliation, address, and e-mail address; first name, middle initial and last name, affiliation, address, and e-mail address for each co-author.

Body

The body of the abstract should follow the title and byline. The first paragraph should start flush with the left margin and all subsequent paragraphs should be indented five spaces with

no blank line between paragraphs. Abstracts should be formatted with 1-inch margins at the top and sides and in 12-point font.

At the bottom of the page, please include the following information:

- Keywords: (Up to five keywords)
- Presentation Preference: (oral, poster, or either)
- Is this a student presentation? (Yes or No)
- Are you an undergraduate student? (Yes or No)
