New Strategic Plan

Over the past year, the Wisconsin AWRA Board completed its first-ever strategic plan to assess where we are as a Wisconsin water science community, where we want to go, and how best to get there. Based on feedback from last year's conference, our main goals are to build organizational capacity, broaden the reach and inclusion of our community, and improve our offerings to members. Dan's talk will be a conversation with AWRA's Matt Diebel about phosphorus, water quality, and Dan's perspectives on water in Wisconsin. The talk will be followed by a book signing at the poster session.
